Item 1 Call to Order at 6:36pm with 22 people online Quorum Count - a quorum is 9 out of 17 members was attained at 6:33pm

Item 2 Non-Agenda Public Comments Issues *not* on the Agenda and within the jurisdiction of PBPG

Carolyn Chase - update on Parks Master Plan - Draft 4 of the PMP was heard at Council Committee Public Safety & Livable Neighborhoods and the Committee voted unanimously to recommend approval with several changes made as part of the motion including: annual review and report to Council, Council oversight of allocations recommendations from the Mayor, an adjustment to the Recreational Value points system to the points value for parks less than one acre and others. The plan is for it to go to full City Council on Tuesday, August 3rd. The Park And Recreation Coalition reviewed the changes in Draft 4 and created another letter with recommendations. Several of those were adopted. One notable change in Draft 3 due to our efforts was to add a policy requiring trees in public parks to the maximum extent feasible and to limit substitution of artificial shade for tree shade to be more consistent with the Climate Action Plan.

Item 7a: #690081: 1902-1908 Chalcedony Street Condominium TMW Presenter: Maggie Rowland of MRowland Management Services Description: Process 3 Condo Conversion Tentative Map Waiver (TMW) to convert four units currently under construction under Permit Number 663992. RM-2-5/RM-1-1 Zone. The Subcommittee reviewed and recommended approval at the July 8 meeting. 1/8 of an acre; was presented previously and approved. Voted 4-1 at Subcommittee due to a sign posted already related to a sale. Corner of Chalcedony and Lamont.

Marcella expressed concerns that developers don't really care about community input by putting forsale signs prior to approval.

Site is 0.42 acres in the CC-4-2 zone. The Subcommittee reviewed and recommended approval at the July 8 meeting. was presented previously and approved at Lamont & Hornblend.

7:01pm Ed presented the project and requests adoption by unanimous consent at 7:02 JT asks what is the timing for the units going on the market - is the owner's intent to sell? A - hope it could be finished within six months and also construction has to be completed and will take somewhat longer.

It would be possible for them to sell but generally this developer holds on to it awhile.

RS-1-7 zone. The Subcommittee reviewed and recommended approval at the July 8 meeting. New Single Family Residence - architect and co-owner Jeanne Liem - vacant lot on west and north - one adjacent house on the east; will "Follow the Slope" minimize grading; roof deck; new retaining wall next to neighbor's existing wall. MOTION to Approve by Unanimous Consent at 7:09pm

Item 7d: #659043: 1002 to 1012 Van Nuys/Cass Street PROW Vacation Presenter: Charlie and Mia Sher of 990 Van Nuys Street

Description: Process 5 – Concurrent processing by PB and La Jolla Planning Groups. Vacation of Public Right Of Way (PROW) of the undeveloped portion of Cass Street north of Van Nuys Street,

totaling 8,800 square feet of land (0.20 acre). RS-1-7 zone. The Subcommittee reviewed at the July 8 meeting and voted to forward to full PBPG board. Showed Eco-District check-list and floor plans.

Where Cass St dead ends at the border with La Jolla Planning Group Area - this lot is one lot west of the prior project under Item 7d.

There is currently one paper street and an alley along with other paper streets and that have already been vacated.

Is there a public use? the property north of the alley has already been vacated. The alley south of that is not being vacated.

This is private land and if the city has no plan to develop it, they city returns it to the owners. The city didn't pay for the land.

Inquired about possible public use but it wouldn't be good for a park. The Subcommittee made no recommendation.

Donna Sher - asking for improvements to the PROW - it has two driveways, a west and an east driveway and was built more than 50 years ago and was designed with a pull through situation but the west driveway is too steep and no longer functional. Want to eliminate the west driveway and create ped access to the entry that leaves the east driveway as the sole way to go in and out of the garage. Designed an expansion into the PROW to allow the cars to exit in a forward manner. There is no public use for the ROW. All City departments reviewed and said they have no use for it and therefore must offer to the owners on the center line of the street. The extra footage will allow cars to exit safely. We would be responsible for extending the sidewalk but this isn't realistic given the grade - and we don't own that property. The existing driveway is permitted via an EMRA Encroachment Maintenance Removal Agreement.

CDC - this is private property with a public ROW on it, correct?

JT - it was dedicated on a map and the city could use it to build - and if this passes the property goes to owners on either side.

Chloe Kerns Edge - owns the lot above and is concerned about access - important that we keep the alley open for fire access

EG - the alley is being kept open

Chloe Kerns Edge - I own the six lots and we paid a lot of money for it (Rutgers Rd - that's part of my property) - people going up there are trespassing on my property.

JT Makes a Motion to approval Second by SP at 7:39pm

Discussion - it is a ROW made for streets and utilities and the alley is not included and easement for sewer and water is maintained so her utilities can still go through there and this site is not appropriate for a park and could not be used for a park due to the easement.

SP - understanding the situation we should cede the ROW back

Chair - City is requiring a curb and sidewalk

AG - if we authorize this action it would be south of where the alley extension would go

MB - Any alternatives? to keep the easement in place?

JL - The city can take it at any time if we don't vacate and there is no other safe alternative Brian Curry - this has come up before and there is no option for a park or anything else. 28 people online

MOTION Approved at 7:50pm without objection 9-0-1 with Chair not voting and PH abstaining

Item 9: Pacific Beach Recreation Center Mural Project (Informational) was taken out of order

Brian Curry reported on the status of the PB Rec Center project: Pacific Beach Community Surf Garden art project for the north side of the Rec Center AND also on the south side above the roof

line. Rec Center was built in 1954; they are repainting the inside nicely. pbtowncouncil.org is main sponsor and working for community adopt the project. Asking for donations. Artist is Rob Tobin artistrobtobin.com specializes in community and reuse art. Budget of \$50K and probably halfway there. You can have a tile installed on to the mosaic! Surf boards can still be donated - drop off at Fitness West. More info: pbtowncouncil.org Hope to finish this fall.

Item 8: Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) 2021 Priorities List (Action Item)

Steve Pruett reported on the subcommittee's recommendations at 8:02pm (22 people online) and presented the group's CIP priorities. The City asked CPGs to revisit and consider opportunities for any 'shovel ready' projects. Subcommittee recommendations moved improvements for Mission Bay Dr and Grand access to the top due to benefits across planning areas and #2: Balboa Pedestiran and Mobility Access Improvements - (added new projects from the Balboa Station Plan that had never been put on any CIP list.) #3 is then Intersection Improvements includ Roundabout, Crosswalks, Ped Beasons, 4. Mission Bay Dr Sidewalks, 5. Street Light improvements, 6. PB Pathways Bike Lane expansion 7. PB Entrance Signs 8. Community Bike Racks. Removed Place making (not well enough defined) and one-way street evaluation and ped bridge over I-5 - because it's not appropriate for our planning group since it would be multi-agency and not really in PB.

Motion to Approve by CDC Second by MB at 8:15pm

Denise Friedman - been involved in Crown Pt - La Cima and Loring are fully funded. Lamont is more complicated - consider removing projects that are funded and in design and make it clear they are ready to move forward.

SP - we'll confirm and then apply

Eve A - they proposed the trolley, everything we had already asked for was on there - we've asked for help around Bluffside and gotten nothing. Also point out dangers around Foothill.

Ed G - what about Mission Blvd redesign project and other improvements aren't on the list? SP - they weren't on the list from January...didn't think to add them and it probably should be added CDC Amend motion to add Mission Blvd projects to the list / MB agrees.

MOTION Approved 9-0-1 GD voting no stating that he's personally opposed to roundabouts and Chair not voting at 8:26pm

Item 10: San Diego City Redistricting Commission Outreach (Informational) 8:38pm 22 people online

District 2 Redistricting Commissioner Fred Kosmo and Laura Fleming Chief of Staff to the City's Redistricting Commission gave a presentation

Encourage you to go on website and complete public comment form; meets on their Thursdays. Used the census data to evaluate district lines so that each district has about 1/9 of the population. Mandated by State and Federal law. There are nine commissioners with one rep from each of the Council Districts. Completely independent to determine equitable districts. Best guess to receive new census by end of Sept and need lines by December 15 in order to prep for next election. Total deviation from 1/9th of the population should be less than 10%. Current lines were 4.59% deviation citywide. www.SanDiego.gov/redistricting-commission Meets on 3rd Thursdays at 3pm. <a href="mailto:emai

Fred Kosmo - from the SANDAG map you can see that D2 is a little too large and La Jolla is a little large and D3 is really large and there will be pressure to move lines around D2 - reach out to us

Item 11: Senate Bills Ad Hoc Subcommittee (Informational)

Chair Steve Pruett will reported on the status of SB 9 and SB 10 at 8:37pm

Checked status today:

SB9 in Assembly and referred to Aprops/already passed Senate and some changes to language being proposed around Coastal Zone being exempted from 2 units on single family lots

SB10 upzoning up to ten units in a transit area - out of Senate and in Assembly and passed Local Gov't Committee; Been amended and add language related to more than ten units then CEQA would apply.

Met with Assembly Member Chris Ward along with CDC and he listened to our concerns thanks to Rachel.

SB5 - Affordable Housing bill would create \$6.5 billion bond fund to create rental or owned affordable housing

Moving through the Senate

SB15 passed Senate and in Assembly - allows rezones for idle retail for low or moderate-income housing - good bill

Much better than 9 and 10 - this is a pathway to create housing more quickly where there is already infrastructure and this would make it happen.

Item 12: Streets & Sidewalks Subcommittee (Informational) at 8:45pm

Chair Jessie Beckman will reported on some safety concerns at Cardeno and will be installing pedhelpful lights. Update on park pilot proposal will be heard July 20th at 10 at City Council. Routine meetings have been going well. Slow Streets Ad Hoc Committee for Beautiful PB has been meeting but attendance has been waning. Circulate SD rec'd a SANDAG grant to do outreach. Sept 11/12 will be a pop-up event to engage public on changes and info about Slow Streets and needs volunteers. Also will be doing traffic counts on Diamond and Missouri.

Eve Anderson reported on Garnet Block Captains tree maintenance event. Trying to save every tree they can and keep them in good shape.
