Item 5 PBPG Chair's Report by Karl Rand

Crown Point water mains project: they are doing the trenching in the streets for the replacements being done underground. They won't be repaving the streets completely because SDG&E is going to do undergrounding there in the near future. Will be repaved correctly after undergrounding is completed

CPC Update: Spaces to Places - program to allow on a more permanent basis for street/sidewalk eateries; not seeking community input even though CPC requested to be able to discuss.

Redistricting: meetings have been happening

Slow Streets event happening this Saturday on Diamond.

Coastal Commission is reviewing STVR Ordinance and D2 asked me to serve on a Committee to advise,

Trolley Festivals happened last weekend between the three new stations closest to PB

REDISTRICTING: MB - Population gets redivided every ten years and D2 lost about 4.5% of population so we need to add areas some where.

D1 has to shed about 10% of their area. We might pick up Mission Hills and Old Town....and maybe into Downtown. Encourages you to attend. Final action has to go into the County by December 14th.

Item 6a #681648: 1420 & 1422 Pacific Beach Drive - Vesting Tentative Map Presenter: Robert Bateman of San Diego Land Surveying Description: Process 4 Condo Conversion Tentative Map to convert eight residential units in two buildings that are currently under construction in the RM-2-5 Zone. The underlying development permit was approved by PBPG 14-0 in October of 2019. The Subcommittee reviewed at the September 2 meeting and recommended approval. With 5 attached, 2-car garages.

Item 6b #684900: 965 & 967 Diamond Street - Vesting Tentative Map Presenter: Robert Bateman of San Diego Land Surveying Description: Process 3 Condo Conversion Tentative Map Waiver to convert two residential units that were constructed in 2015. The 0.07 acre site is in the RM-1-1 Zone. The Subcommittee reviewed at the September 2 meeting and recommended approval.

SC - Q - why do developments pursue permits first as apartments and then come back later to change to condos?

A. For condos You have to have all the mapping done before you start and if it's labeled as a condo some contractors might not want to work on it without proper insurance so to start as condos from the beginning takes longer. This was built 5 years ago and the owner is doing an exchange with her brother.

MOTION TO APPROVE by CDC/JT at 6:59pm **10-2-1 motion passes** with noes: PG & GD and PH abstaining due to lack of contextual info about the project, Chair not voting

Item 7 Channel Maintenance Project near MBHS (Action Item) was heared beginning at 7:08pm with 24 people online

Ashley Dulaney, Stormwater Department Planer, will report on this project involving the cleaning and repair of flood channels near Mission Bay High School, similar to the work done in April of 2015. Storm water infrastructure must be maintained properly to control flooding. Project is to remove debris and sediment with bulldozers and excavators. Required for the channel to function properly. Substantail conformance with Storm Water Maintenance Plan.

Recommendation from Planning Group is required. Doing two channels: PB-Olney 1 and MBHS 1. <u>Adulaney@sandiego.gov</u>, Assistance Planner

SC - Is this one-time or ongoing maintenace that would prevent build-up over time?

A - we do routine maintenance and try to get in there very few years. We did work in 2015 and with regular water flow, vegetation regrowth is rapid.

SC - what is the cost?

A - don't know

SC - what mitigation?

A - it was previously maintained in 2015 and we mitigated previously and as long as we are in the same area there is no additional wetlands mitigation.

SC - regular - monthly? - maintenance would reduce growth of trees - we've waited too long so now that heavy equipment is required to clean it out

Does this drain into the ocean?

A - it drains into Mission Bay and during non-storm events, it's diverted into the sewere system, during excess flows it goes into Mission Bay.

MOTION at 7:25pm by SC/AG to Approve the channel cleanings and have the PBPG send a letter including requesting project costs and asking city to reply how it will be maintained so it does not require significant remediation after years of neglect.

Chair: Timeframe?

A - still working to get permits into place and start later this year - no specifics at this time.

Q- are you going to the Mission Bay Park Committee?

A - no

CDC - what will happen to the biological materials being scooped up?

A - will be disposed of at Miramar

CDC - disposed of or composted?

A - if it can be separated out it can go into composting but often the materials are mixed with items that cannot be composted.

PG - have you contacted Frieds of Rose Creek and Kendall-Frost marsh

A - not on this specifically, but have been in contact with them on the overal maintenance plans. Property owners do get a public notice so UCSD would have gotten the notice

Call the question at 7:31pm MOTION Passes without objection. 13-0-0 with Chair not voting and the Chair assigns SC to write the letter.

Item 8 Water Main and Sewer Improvements near Olney and Garnet (Informational)

Rex Navaez from the City's Engineering & Capital Projects office provided a project introduction for Water and Sewer Group 1036 part of the overall improvement program mandating replacements of pipelines at the end of the useful lives. Replacing approx 2 miles of existing water main; 0.4 miles of sewer lines and replaces manholes, hdrants, laterals, etc. Scheduled for this fall and will take a little ore than a year completed in winter of 2022 costing \$6.1 million

PG - some of those streets are part of PB PathWays - will the city redo the sherrows to indicate this again?

A - yes
